School Uniform

We value the support of our parents and carers in ensuring our students are dressed and prepared correctly for each school day.

We welcome the support of our parents and carers with making sure students meet our high expectations and are proud of their association with Stowmarket High School by wearing the correct uniform.

We have had issues with small numbers of students having facial piercings, leggings, and hoodies, and we politely remind you to ensure your child does not have any of these items ahead of coming into school each day. We will be celebrating with a work experience rewards assembly during our careers week which is running from 8th to 12th July, more details on the full programme will be shared with you after the half term break.







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
