New Year, Same High Expectations

As we welcomed our students back for the start of 2025, our key focus was on reflection and direction. We asked them to consider what their opening chapter of the year looked like, the legacy they left in the autumn term, and the kind of person they aspire to be by the end of 2025. Education is















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a catalyst for success in many forms, and we encouraged students to see that school offers everyone something valuable they can take forward in life.

We also spoke about the power of choice. Our behaviour shapes our future, and ultimately, we alone control our responses to any situation. This is central to the 'Stowmarket Way,' which upholds our values of **R**espect, Integrity, **S**uccess, and **E**mpathy—qualities we believe are every bit as important as academic qualifications.

January is an excellent time for all of us—adults and students alike—to establish good habits. Accordingly, we reminded students of our uniform expectations, clarifying what is and isn't acceptable. To lighten the mood, we used a local football analogy: Ipswich Town players wouldn't run onto the pitch wearing a hoodie or, even worse, Norwich colours! It helped illustrate how our uniform sets a standard similar to what they'll encounter in later life or the workplace.

We also clarified our rules on mobile phones. The Department for Education is clear on the issue of phones in schools, and while we don't enforce a total ban, mobile phones shouldn't be used or visible during the school day. We operate an 'on-site, out-of-sight' policy, which we believe strikes the right balance between practicality and preventing disruptions.

I'd like to make a special plea regarding basic equipment. Last term, I personally handed out over 200 black pens! It's surprising how often pens, pencils, and rulers are forgotten, while mobile phones never seem to be left behind. Whether or not Santa was generous with stationery, I would be very grateful if you could support your child by checking they have what they need each day. Learning to be organised and prepared is a life skill, and your help in establishing that routine is greatly appreciated. Finally, I want to say a heartfelt "well done" to the majority of our students who make excellent choices day after day. They are a credit to themselves, to the school, and to you. For the few who need more support in making positive decisions, we reminded them of how our rewards system works and the consequences for not meeting expectations.

Our ethos at Stowmarket High School is that everyone should behave in a way that allows staff to teach and all students to learn to the best of their ability, within a safe and supportive environment. By arriving on time, wearing the correct uniform, and bringing the right equipment, students can start each day prepared. They should follow the guidance of staff whose goal is to help them succeed. If you have any concerns, your child's Form Tutor is always your first port of call, with support from the relevant Head of Year.

Looking ahead, we continue to value pastoral care and personal development. This term's assemblies and tutor programme will include guidance on next steps, option choices for certain year groups, and reflections on how past experiences can guide future success. We're pleased to welcome guest speakers from Kooth to discuss children's mental health, and near Easter, we'll wrap up with praise assemblies (where plenty of chocolate is sure to appear!).

Thank you, as always, for your continued support. Here's to another successful term for all our students.

KS4 Options Process

Year 9 students are at the start of the process of selecting their GCSE and BTEC options for Year 10. This is the most important stage in your child's education so far and we understand it can be an anxious time. Making the right decisions and choices is of vital importance. In Key Stage 4, students will be focused on the subjects/qualifications they are studying and preparing for the examinations in Year 11. Students will be taking courses that will help them to prepare for further study, maybe on an A-Level/Level 3 course at Sixth Form or at college, through an apprenticeship or studying T-Levels.

I would also like to invite you to the GCSE Options Evening on Thursday 27 February 2025 from 4.30pm in the School Hall. The evening is specifically for students in Year 9 and their parents/carers. The aims of the evening are to:

- Find out about the GCSE Year 10 & 11 curriculum. Main talks at 4.40pm and 5.30pm
- Find out what is involved in studying specific subjects in Years 10 & 11
- Be aware of the advice and guidance available from the school and other sources
- Be aware of the timescales for making choices about Key Stage 4 study
- An opportunity to meet subject leaders and staff keen to talk about their curriculum offer
- An opportunity to speak to specialist staff for personalised support from Mrs Mylrea Careers coordinator and/or SENDco Mrs Broxton









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Following the Options Evening, students will be required to complete and submit a Microsoft Form indicating their final GCSE option choices. **The Form will go live from Monday 3rd March and must be submitted by 6.00pm on Monday 10th March 2025.**
