Aware that a draw would be enough to claim the championship,

Stowmarket displayed excellent game management, maintaining possession until the final whistle to secure their place in the regional finals.

It was fantastic to see three Year 7 students - Emily Williams, Olaya Lopez, and Lily Pemberton make the squad. Despite their younger age, they performed exceptionally well alongside their older teammates. A special mention also goes to Faith Powell, who finished as the tournament's top goal scorer, closely followed by Keri.
